The Directors of Platinum Investment Management Limited (trading as Platinum Asset Management®) (ABN 25 063 565 006 AFSL 221935), the responsible entity of the Platinum International Fund (Quoted Managed Hedge Fund) (the “registered scheme” or “Fund”), present their report on the registered scheme for the half-year ended 31 December 2018.

Principal Activities

The Platinum International Fund (Quoted Managed Hedge Fund) (ASX code: PIXX) is an Australian registered managed investment scheme. Its units are quoted on the Australian Securities Exchange (ASX) under the ASX AQUA Rules.

The PIXX is an ASX-quoted version of the unlisted flagship fund Platinum International Fund (PIF). PIXX is a feeder fund that primarily invests in units of PIF, giving investors access to PIF's portfolio composition, portfolio managers and investment strategies. The returns of PIXX may vary slightly from the returns of PIF's performance fee P Class due to different cash holdings and as well as gains and losses on redemptions of PIXX units.

The principal activity of PIXX during the half-year was to invest in units of the PIF and some cash. The underlying fund, or PIF, invests in the securities of companies listed on stock exchanges throughout the world, that the Investment Manager perceives to be undervalued, in accordance with the Product Disclosure Statement (PDS) and the Constitution.

As part of Platinum’s long-term succession planning, Andrew Clifford was appointed as the Managing Director of PIML effective 1 July 2018, replacing Kerr Neilson.

Kerr Neilson remains a full time executive director of Platinum Asset Management Limited and a member of Platinum’s investment team, continuing to work on the generation of investment ideas and company research.

Date of commencement and significant changes in the state of affairs

PIXX was formally registered on 18 August 2017 and commenced trading on 14 September 2017.

There were no significant changes to the state of affairs of the registered scheme during the half-year.

Operating and Financial Review (OFR)

At 31 December 2018, PIXX’s Funds Under Management (“FUM”) was \$296.3 million¹ (30 June 2018: \$213.8 million). The six month return for the period from 1 July 2018 to 31 December 2018 was negative 8.2%. The benchmark Morgan Stanley Capital International All Country World Net Index (MSCI) in A\$ terms for the same period was negative 4.5%². The Fund’s annualised return since inception date² on 12 September 2017 to 31 December 2018 was negative 0.01% (compound per annum), below the MSCI which delivered 7.4% since inception.

¹ The reason for the variance between the FUM figure of \$296.3 million and the net assets figure of \$295.5 million reported in the financial statements relates to the fact that net assets were calculated in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards and are valued using the redemption price as at 31 December 2018.

² PIXX’s returns are calculated using PIXX’s net asset value per unit (which does not include the buy/sell spread) and represent PIXX’s combined income and capital returns over the specified period. Returns are net of accrued fees and costs, are pre-tax, and assume the reinvestment of distributions.

For the purpose of calculating the “since inception” returns of the MSCI index, PIXX’s inception date (12 September 2017) is used. Index returns assume the reinvestment of dividends from constituent companies, but do not reflect fees and expenses. Platinum does not invest by reference to the weightings of any index or benchmark, and index returns are provided as a reference only. PIXX’s underlying assets are chosen through Platinum’s bottom-up investment process and, as a result, PIXX’s holdings may vary considerably to the make-up of the index.

Operating and Financial Review (OFR) continued

As at 31 December 2018, PIXX Net Asset Value per unit was \$4.4086 (30 June 2018: after the 30 June 2018 distribution was \$4.8012).

The interim period has been challenging for the underlying Fund. Investment performance was primarily impacted by China's financial reforms (and the resulting unintended Chinese economic slowdown caused by the tightening of credit). The Chinese economic slowdown was exacerbated by uncertainty surrounding the US-China trade war and rising US interest rates, resulting in the heavy sell-off of out of favour stocks that were sensitive to economic growth or exposed to trade issues, as the market gravitated towards "safer" more expensive stocks, that were perceived to be immune to uncertainty.

The Investment Manager is of the view that the catalysts for the tough 2018 year are all starting to reverse, with policy loosening in China, talk of a "ceasefire" in the trade war and moderation in market expectations for US rate rises.

In terms of outlook "*the attractive valuations of our holdings entail a cautiously optimistic outlook regarding the Fund's prospective returns*".

Changes in portfolio management responsibilities

As part of Platinum's long-term succession planning, the portfolio management responsibilities for PIF changed. PIF was previously co-managed with the following allocations: Kerr Neilson 50%; Andrew Clifford 40% and Clay Smolinski 10%. From 1 July 2018, these allocations changed to Andrew Clifford 70% and Clay Smolinski 30%. Kerr Neilson will continue as a full-time executive director of Platinum Asset Management Limited and member of the Platinum investment team.

Rounding of amounts to the nearest thousand dollars

The registered scheme is of a kind referred to in ASIC Corporations "*Rounding in Financial/Directors' Reports*" Instrument 2016/191, issued by the Australian Securities and Investments Commission, relating to 'rounding-off'.

Amounts in this report have been rounded off in accordance with this Instrument to the nearest thousand dollars, unless otherwise indicated.

Note 1. General information

Platinum Investment Management Limited ABN 25 063 565 006 AFSL 221935 is the responsible entity of the registered scheme. The registered office is Level 8, 7 Macquarie Place, Sydney, NSW 2000.

Note 2. Basis of preparation of the interim financial report

This financial report for the interim reporting period ended 31 December 2018 has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134 *Interim Financial Reporting* and the *Corporations Act 2001*. Compliance with AASB 134 ensures compliance with International Financial Reporting Standard IAS 34: *Interim Financial Reporting*.

These financial statements for the interim financial report ended 31 December 2018 do not include all the notes of the type normally included in an annual financial report. Accordingly, this report is to be read in conjunction with the financial report for the year ended 30 June 2018 and any public pronouncements made in respect of the registered scheme during the interim reporting period.

The accounting policies are consistent with those of the previous financial year and corresponding interim reporting period, unless otherwise stated. Comparative information has been reclassified, where appropriate, to enhance comparability.

New accounting standards adopted for the interim reporting period ended 31 December 2018

The following Australian Accounting Standards were adopted by the registered scheme for the interim reporting period ended 31 December 2018 for the first time.

(a) New accounting standards and interpretations

Other than as noted below, there are no standards, interpretations or amendments to existing standards that are effective for the first time from 1 July 2018 that have a material impact on the amounts recognised in the prior periods or will affect the current or future periods.

(b) Adoption of AASB 9: *Financial Instruments* (and applicable amendments) ("AASB 9")

AASB 9: *Financial Instruments* addresses the classification, measurement and de-recognition of financial assets and financial liabilities. It has now also introduced revised rules around hedge accounting and impairment. The standard was applicable from 1 January 2018.

The registered scheme has adopted AASB 9 for reporting periods commencing 1 July 2018. AASB 9 replaces the classification and measurement model in AASB 139 *Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement* with a new model that classifies financial instruments based on the business model within which the financial instruments are managed, and whether the contractual cash flows under the instrument solely represent the payment of principal and interest.

Under the new standard, financial instruments are classified as:

- amortised cost if the objective of the business model is to hold the financial instruments to collect contractual cash flows and those cash flows represent solely payments of principal and interest (SPPI);
- fair value through other comprehensive income if the objective of the business model is to hold the financial instruments to collect contractual cashflows from SPPI and to sell; or
- all other financial instruments must be recognised at fair value through profit or loss. An entity can, at initial recognition, also irrevocably designate a financial instrument as measured at fair value through profit or loss if it eliminates or significantly reduces a measurement or recognition inconsistency. Derivative and equity instruments are measured at fair value through profit or loss unless, for equity instruments not held for trading, an irrevocable option is taken to measure at fair value through other comprehensive income.

Note 2. Basis of preparation of the interim financial report (continued)

AASB 9 has been applied retrospectively by the registered scheme and did not result in a change to the classification or measurement of financial instruments, given no debt instruments are held by the registered scheme, which could result in a reclassification of the financial instruments to amortised cost or fair value through other comprehensive income ("FVOCI"). The derecognition rules have not been changed from previous requirements and the registered scheme does not apply hedge accounting.

(c) Financial instruments

Classification

The registered scheme classifies its investments based on its business model for managing those investments and their contractual cash flow characteristics. The registered scheme's portfolio of financial assets and financial liabilities is managed and performance is evaluated on a fair value basis in accordance with the registered scheme's documented investment strategy. The registered scheme's policy is for the Responsible Entity to evaluate the information about its investments on a fair value basis together with other related financial information.

For equity security and forward currency contracts, the contractual cash flows held by the registered scheme are not solely principal and interest. Consequently, these investments are measured at fair value through profit or loss.

Recognition

The registered scheme recognises financial assets and financial liabilities on the date it becomes party to the contractual agreement and recognises changes in the fair value of financial assets or financial liabilities from this date. Investments are derecognised when the contractual right to receive cash flows from the investments have expired or have been transferred, and the registered scheme has transferred substantially all of the risks and rewards of ownership.

Measurement

At initial recognition, the registered scheme measures financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value. Transaction costs of financial assets carried at fair value through profit or loss are expensed in the statements of comprehensive income.

Subsequent to initial recognition, all financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss are measured at fair value. Gains and losses arising from changes in the fair value of the 'financial assets or financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss' category are presented in the statement of comprehensive income within "Unrealised (losses)/gains on units held in the Platinum International Fund" in the period in which they arise.

For further details on how the fair values of the financial assets and liabilities held at fair value are determined, please see note 7 to the financial statements.

AASB 15: Revenue from contracts with customers

The AASB has issued a new standard for the recognition of revenue. This will replace AASB 118 which covers contracts for goods and services and AASB11 which covers construction contracts.

The registered scheme has adopted this standard for the interim period ended 31 December 2018. The main objective of this standard is to provide a single revenue recognition model based on the transfer of goods and services and the consideration expected to be received in return for that transfer.

The registered scheme's main source of income for the half-year is interest and unrealised (losses)/gains on units held in Platinum International Fund. These income types are outside the scope of the standard. The standard was assessed as not having a material impact on the Fund's results in the current or future reporting periods.

New Accounting Standards and Interpretations not yet mandatory for the 31 December 2018 reporting period

There are no other current standards that are not yet effective that are expected to have a material impact on the registered scheme in the current or future reporting periods and on foreseeable future transactions.

The registered scheme measures and recognises the units held in the Platinum International Fund, as a fair value investment, pursuant to AASB 13, on a recurring basis.
