The Directors consider that the pre-tax net tangible asset backing per share, after the deduction of fees and expenses, adjusted for corporate taxes paid and any capital flows, and assuming the reinvestment of dividends ("pre-tax NTA"), is a better measure of performance of the Company than the reported profits or losses. This is because the pre-tax NTA per share is the most accurate way to assess the investment performance of the Company's investment portfolio. For the 6 months to 31 December 2023, the Company's pre-tax NTA decreased from \$1.55 per share to \$1.51 per share. The decrease is after the payment of 3 cents per share in dividends and 1 cent per share in tax paid during the half-year.

The Directors continue to monitor the Company's share price relative to pre-tax NTA, which continues to trade at a discount, consistent with the broader global equities listed investment company market in Australia. The discount narrowed during the period, resulting in a total shareholder return of 5.4% including grossed up dividends for the 6 months ended 31 December 2023.

With regards to outlook, the Investment Manager reports that:

### Directors' report



The Directors present their report, together with the financial statements of Platinum Capital Limited (the "Company") for the halfyear ended 31 December 2023.

#### **PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES**

The Company is a listed investment company established to provide capital growth over the long term by investing in companies worldwide which the investment manager perceives to be undervalued by the market.

#### **OPERATING AND FINANCIAL REVIEW**

For the 6 months to 31 December 2023, the profit before income tax was \$1,478,000 (31 December 2022: profit of \$31,828,000) and profit after income tax was \$1,048,000 (31 December 2022: profit of \$22,274,000).

For the 6 months to 31 December 2023, the Company delivered a return of 0.2%<sup>1</sup> (measured by its pre-tax NTA) which underperformed the return of 4.6% for the benchmark, the MSCI All Country World Net Index in A\$ terms ("MSCI").<sup>2</sup> This return was achieved with an average net invested position of 73%. The long portfolio contributed positively to the return with the strongest performers in the information technology and materials sectors whilst the short positions detracted from the return.

For the five years to 31 December 2023, the Company delivered an annualised compound return of 6.7% per annum, measured by the Company's pre-tax NTA, versus the MSCI return of 12.4%. The Company's long-term (since inception<sup>3</sup>) return to 31 December 2023 of 10.9% per annum was approximately 3.3% greater than the MSCI return of 7.6%.

The Directors consider that the pre-tax net tangible asset backing per share, after the deduction of fees and expenses, adjusted for corporate taxes paid and any capital flows, and assuming the reinvestment of dividends ("pre-tax NTA"), is a better measure of performance of the Company than its reported profits or losses. This is because the pre-tax NTA is the most accurate way to assess the investment performance of the Company's investment portfolio. For the 6 months to 31 December 2023, the Company's pre-tax NTA decreased from \$1.55 to \$1.51. The decrease includes the payment of 3 cents per share in dividends paid and 1 cent per share in tax paid during the half-year.

Total Shareholder Return (TSR) for the half-year, based on share price movement and grossed up dividends, between 1 July 2023 and 31 December 2023 was 5.4%. The TSR is higher than the pre-tax NTA return of 0.2% primarily due to a decrease in the discount of the share price to pre-tax NTA since 30 June 2023.

In the December 2023 quarterly report, the Investment Manager made the following comments in respect to the outlook:

#### **CAPITAL MANAGEMENT**

The Directors continue to monitor the Company's share price relative to pre-tax NTA, which continues to trade at a discount, consistent with the global equities closed end listed investment market in Australia.

The Company commenced an on-market share buy-back within the "10/12 limit" with effect from 18 October 2023 to provide liquidity to existing shareholders and accretion to continuing shareholders. During the half-year period ended 31 December 2023, 1,342,232 shares were bought-back and cancelled.

We believe that the discount is mainly influenced by investment performance and market sentiment for the sector. The ASX graph below indicates the discount across the listed investment company/trust sector.

During the half-year period ended 31 December 2023, 13,602 options were exercised. The options expire on 28 March 2024.

The Company's capital management policy is to smooth dividends over time and, where possible, retain a reasonable level of franking credits to enable payment of fully-franked dividends in the future. The Company does not believe that it is in the Company's or shareholders' interests to pay unfranked dividends, resulting in a tax liability in the shareholders' hands and reduced investment capacity for the Company to generate future returns.

#### DIVIDENDS

The Directors determined to pay a 2024 fully-franked interim dividend of 3 cents per share (\$8,848,122), with a record date of 8 March 2024 and payable to shareholders on 28 March 2024, out of the dividend profit reserve. Together with the 2023 final dividend of 3 cents per share, this represents a grossed-up dividend yield of 6.7% based on the 31 December 2023 closing share price. The available franking credit balance after providing for the 2024 interim dividend would enable the payment of future fully-franked dividends of up to 4.7 cents per share.

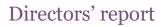


The 2024 interim dividend record date and payment date is circa two weeks later than previous periods. The purpose of the change in timing is to provide option holders with the opportunity to exercise options after the dividend announcement and receive additional shares before the dividend record date. #### Valuation process

The valuation of each investment that the Company holds is the primary responsibility of the Investment Manager. The investment manager's Securities Pricing Committee has authority to review and approve valuation methodologies to be applied to determine the fair values of portfolio securities and other assets held by the Company for which no quoted market price is readily available, and to make recommendations to the Board.

The Securities Pricing Committee also assesses whether an adjustment is required to the quoted market price of any security, if it is considered that the quoted market price is not reasonable (for example securities with a so-called "stale" price). A register is maintained documenting the valuation used and the basis for the valuation of any security or investment that may be manually adjusted or manually priced. The Securities Pricing Committee meets on a quarterly basis, and also on an ad hoc basis as is required.

#### Fair value of financial instruments not carried at fair value

The carrying value of trade receivables and trade payables are assumed to approximate their fair values.

#### NOTE 10. INVESTMENT MANAGER FEES

The investment manager receives a monthly management fee for investment services provided in accordance with the investment management agreement (the "Agreement"). The Agreement provides for a management fee payable monthly and calculated at 1.1% (June 2023: 1.1%) per annum of the adjusted portfolio value (which includes cash and deposits and adjusted for any taxes paid/refunded, dividends paid and capital flows).

A performance fee is payable for each financial year ending 30 June equivalent to 15% of the amount by which the portfolio's annual performance exceeds the return achieved by the MSCI (MSCI is the Morgan Stanley Capital International All Country World Net Index in \$A) for that financial year. Where the portfolio's annual performance is less than the MSCI, the amount of the underperformance is aggregated, carried forward and deducted from the annual performance in the subsequent year before calculating any performance fee for that year. The aggregate underperformance is carried forward until a performance fee becomes payable.

#### NOTE 10. INVESTMENT MANAGER FEES (CONTINUED)

For the 6 months to 31 December 2023, pre-tax performance of the portfolio was 0.2%<sup>1</sup> and the corresponding MSCI was 4.6%. This represents an underperformance of 4.4% against the MSCI for the half-year. Taking into account the aggregate underperformance of 39.2% from the prior periods, no performance fee has been accrued. A total aggregate underperformance of 43.6% will need to be made up before a performance fee will be payable.

In the event of termination of the Agreement by the Company for convenience, the Investment Manager will be eligible to receive a termination fee equivalent to the management fee of 1.1% of the portfolio value (adjusted for any taxes paid/refunded, dividends paid and capital flows) and the performance fee (calculated as set forth above) if any, for the period from the first business day of the month in which termination is effective to the date which is the first anniversary of that date. No termination fee is payable to the investment manager where the agreement is terminated for cause.

Each party is required to provide three months' notice to terminate the Agreement for convenience. However, the Company may terminate the Agreement for cause at any time by written notice to the Investment Manager in certain instances.

#### NOTE 11. EVENTS AFTER THE REPORTING PERIOD

Apart from the dividend declared on 22 February 2024 as set out in Note 5 and share buyback up to 22 February 2024 as set out in Note 6, no other significant matter or circumstance has arisen since 31 December 2023 that has significantly affected, or may significantly affect the Company's operations, the results of those operations, or the Company's state of affairs in future financial years.
